#### **Welcome SWAC**

During the negotiation process for Voluntary Marine Rescue Brisbane Inc. (VMRB) to transition to Marine Rescue Queensland - Sandgate, the former VMRB members were entirely focused on the community.


They place great value in their role not only as a water response rescue unit but as an anchor for the community to come together.

To preserve this community legacy outside of their water rescue function, they negotiated VMRB trade as Sandgate Water Activities Club (SWAC) to ensure the facilities and the opportunities that come with that continue to serve the community.

SWAC will run as a not-for-profit organisation and will build from the legacy left by the members of VMRB, many of whom also continue to volunteer and support SWAC to grow and succeed.







We are going to implement a holistic, bi-annual crew recruitment program. The first recruitment will commence in early October with the goal of having new crew appointed by the end of November. This timing considers the new MRQ recruitment and approval processes. New crew members will participate in a three rostered crew day rotation with final crew appointment completed by the end of the year.

We have uplifted our training program with passionate volunteers taking the lead. Our training plan focuses on upskilling existing crew members that are in line to complete Competent Crew rank and onboarding new crew. At the moment we have limited Assessor capacity to assist others wanting to progress beyond Competent Crew through to Coxswain but we are working on this.

#### Quebec crew on the water

One the last VMR Brisbane crew day ahead of becoming a Marine Rescue Queensland Unit we started with a navigation exercise around Flinders Reef, north of Moreton Island, combined with our open water hours accrual.

On route we came across a large turtle which had unfortunately died. Such is the circle of life.

As we approached the north of Moreton Island we were treated by whales breaching and fins slapping.

On our return we got a call to attend 4.2m tinnie which had broken down 2.5 nautical miles north of Moreton requiring assistance.

The tinnie with two persons on board (PoB) needed a tow to the Port of Brisbane boat ramp at Whyte Island.

Then back to base to refuel and wash down Sands Rescue 1.


Thomas Grice was awarded Life Member for his commitment to VRMB for over 11 years as President and his huge role in bringing a new generation into the squadron.

# President Report SANDGATE WATER ACTIVITIES CLUB




Hello and welcome to Sandgate Water Activities Club (SWAC),

We held the first Basic Skills course of the season. We ask all new paddlers and those needing a refresher to complete the course before getting on the water with the club.

The course is part of the Paddle Australia Awards program and covers all the basic skills required to be competent to go out with the club on a supported paddle.

Eight enthusiastic participants were kitted out with a kayak, paddle and Personal Flotation Device (PFD) with plenty of experienced paddlers on hand to support. We paddled down Yundah Creek practicing and learning paddle skills, sweep stokes, stern rudder skills, draw strokes, emergency stop, rafting - while enjoying the water.


The flora and fauna up mangrove creek, was new to our first time paddlers, with egrets and herons.

#### WET EXIT SAFETY

After an hour and a half on the water we headed back to Yundah Street boat ramp for the final part of the course – the wet exit and swim. This might not be the most enjoyable part of the course but it is a safety requirement. Paddlers are asked to fall out of their kayak and then swim with it 25m to the boat ramp.

This gives paddlers the skills and confidence to know what to do in an emergency situation. Then back to the club shed to wash up the equipment. Our new paddlers will be supported on follow-up paddles for as long as they need – after that they are free to join in all the other activities of the club.
